



Court Awards Man \$125,000

Robert Leigh Jackson was awarded \$125,000 by a Mobile Circuit Court jury Tuesday in his suit for \$150,000 against Dr. LeBaron A. Foster.

Represented by Bob Byrd and Warren Hammond Jr., the plaintiff claimed permanent injuries in a May 14, 1966, two-vehicle accident on Dauphin Island Parkway at McVay Drive. The plaintiff identified Dr. Foster as the person driving the vehicle which struck his automobile.

Judge Joseph M. Hecklander gave an affirmative charge for Drs. Maynard V. Foster and Warren J. Foster, also named as defendants in the plaintiff's original bill. The judge's charge eliminated the pair as defendants in the final court action.

The plaintiff had claimed that Dr. LeBaron Foster was acting as an agent of Drs. Maynard Foster and Warren Foster, but their attorney, John A. Courtney, argued successfully that the plaintiff failed to prove the contention.

Atty. Vernon Z. Crawford represented Dr. LeBaron Foster.
